# Walk-through High School

# **Construction Update:**

Jake from Scull Construction gave an update and review of walk-through. The gym floor is a warranty item and Scull will not pay subcontractor until it meets the expectations. Scull had a third party inspect the floor, their preliminary overview is that the installation and structure were completed adequately, but it will need to be refinished. Tim Cheever, from Upper Deck, stated the warranty for the floor would not start until the fall of 2022. The rusted items in the kitchen will be replaced and the knobs on the stove will be fixed. A substantial completion for the gym and kitchen has not been completed at this time. Midwest Mechanical will be contacted to provide training to teachers on running the classroom thermostats. Individual thermostats are not managing each classroom independently. Outside heating/cooling unites will be provided with more permanent supports, replacing the blocks of wood that are used at this time.

It was requested that Scull provide Oelrichs School District a lien waver for the work that has been completed. Jake will provide.

Mike Hickey will research what warranty work entails to ensure existing problems get fixed without additional costs to the school. Cope pointed out that there is still work outside that needs to be finished such as erosion control, planting grass, and dirt work.

Fencing around High School mechanical units: Contractor does not recommend chain-linked fence. Will look into other options. Waiting for quote/price.

Welding Equipment Trade-In: Before the trade-in will be applied, the unites need to be sold. Dakota Gold: Members from the Dakota Gold team would like to have a follow-up meeting with a few members of the board to develop strategies over the next 3-5 years. They would like to have a 1-, 3-, and 5-year plan. Dr. Stone will arrange the meeting.

**Board Reports:** Tlustos requested that water and electric meters be checked at the old garage/welding shop.

**Administration Reports**: Dr. Stone updated the board on the Impact Aid Application. Schools are allowed to use prior year's numbers, but Oelrichs has an increase in student enrollment and will be using this year's numbers.

Dr. Stone has been in contact with Tom Allen who is working on an 'Upward Bound' grant. The purpose of the grant is to provide opportunities for students to successfully transition into post-secondary schools.

Currently the tribe is on level 'red' for COVID. The board continues to support face to face learning with opportunities for those students who wish, to receive online learning.

LNI was a success this year. Oelrichs School had students participate in many activities. It was fun for the students, they worked hard, and had no discipline problems.

Principal Peterson informed the board that the end of the semester will be on Friday the 14<sup>th</sup>. She has been working hard with teachers, students, and parents to finish the semester successfully.
